Businesses support Little Free Library Pilot

Our mission at the Wichita Public Library Foundation (WPLF) is to provide a Margin of Excellence and to ensure *everyone* has access to Wichita Public Library resources. Because many people in Wichita face barriers to getting to a Library location, WPLF is focused on providing the Library with resources for out-of-building connections.

Thanks to Everyg's and Hutton Construction's generous support, WPLF will provide the Library resources to place 26 Little Free Libraries (LFLs) in District III. The Library will partner with Wichita Literacy Coalition agencies and community leaders to reach and engage people in District III to host LFLs in areas with the lowest childhood literacy.

By distributing board books, literacy activities, and other resources, this pilot project will give children 0 to 5 access and support parents in teaching them numbers and letters. The LFLs will begin to build a relationship between families that are non-traditional library users and reduce their reluctance to visit a Library based on outdated beliefs and attitudes. If children are excited about reading and the Library, their parents are more likely to make time for a Library visit to the Ronald Walters Library (their neighborhood library) and discover the incredible resources available.

Summer Reading 2022 a Great Success



Because of your donations to WPLF, 8,912 kids, teens, and babies participated in reading, learning, and having fun in youth programs this summer. The reading program is a great way for families to commit to a regular reading habit at home and flex their brains to prevent the summer slide. Summer programming increased by 2,412 youth or 37%. Another impressive statistic is that 49% finished the reading program with 135,054 reading days.

Branch Updates

The City of Wichita recently approved its 2023-2030 Capital Improvement Plan budget, which includes more than \$6.38 million in funding to complete the Library Master Plan. In 2019, a steering committee composed of City Council and Library Board members created a master plan for branch libraries and outreach services to guide facility, program, and service decisions over the next decade. Efforts have included:

- Identifying and/or affirming locations for branch libraries that provide equitable access to library services and resident convenience;

- Establishing and enacting service priorities for each facility and outreach service;
- Changing policies/procedures that are barriers to accomplishing priorities; and
- Guiding improvements at Evergreen Community Center and Library, as well as the relocation of Linwood Park, now the Dr. Ronald W Walters Branch, in District III.

Beginning in late 2022, the City of Wichita and the Library will begin an expansion of the Westlink Branch. In 2023, the Alford Regional Library, Maya Angelou Northeast Branch, and Ford Rockwell Branch will also be slated for renovation.

Programming is one area almost entirely underwritten by your financial support of the WPLF. This fall, the Library has increased programming options, totaling 329.
